DIRECTIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE VOTER IN VOTING

(For use in the constituencies of Ayre, Castletown, Garff, Glenfaba, Michael, Middle, Peel and Malew & Santon)

- 1. The voter may vote for not more than one candidate.
- 2. The voter should see that the ballot paper, before it is handed to him, bears the official mark.
- 3. The voter will go into one of the compartments and, with the pencil provided in the compartment, place a cross on the right hand side of the ballot paper opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.
- 4. The voter will then fold up the ballot paper so as to show the official mark on the back, and leaving the compartment, will, without showing the front of the ballot paper to any person, show the official mark on the back to the presiding officer, and then, in the presence of the presiding officer, put the paper into the ballot box and forthwith leave the polling station.
- 5. If the voter inadvertently spoils a ballot paper he can return it to the presiding officer, who will, if satisfied of such inadvertence, give him another paper.
- 6. If the voter votes for more than one candidate, or places any mark on the paper by which he may afterwards be identified, his ballot paper will not be counted.
- 7. If the voter fraudulently takes a ballot paper out of the polling station or puts into the ballot box any paper other than the one given to him by the presiding officer, he will be liable on conviction to custody for a term not exceeding 6 months.
