Issues I intend to tackle

Education and Training in all its aspects:-

Actively work with and within this sector in order to ensure that Ramsey has facilities second to none and at the same time ensure that such facilities are readily available to all those that wish to take advantage. It is important that the Commissioners work with all sectors of Government on issues affecting our district and none more so than for our children and their education. Our future will at some point be in their hands.

Finances: Income and Expenditure:-

Actively work with everyone involved in this area ensuring that the monies collected for Ramsey by way of the rates and rent are economically and efficiently spent for the benefit of all who live within its boundary. This after all is one of the primary responsibilities and functions of an elected Commissioner.

Health and Safety:-

History and Heritage:-

If after decommissioning the "Old" swimming pool it is found suitable to be converted into a multi purpose or sports centre then I would want to assist and support this initiative in all the ways possible. Issues I intend to tackle

Houses and Housing:-

Actively work towards better housing giving for example support to those that wish to upgrade their existing structures within the existing regulations as may apply.
