Issues I intend to tackle

Onchan Village:-

There are some excellent plans for the improvement and upkeep of the village to enhance facilities for residents. To provide essential facilities e.g. litter bins, dog fouling bins, pavement cleaning, refuse collection etc. with a view to keeping Onchan clean and tidy, I support long term fiscal planning to maintain standards and ensure an effective provision for management and provide good value for money. I am supportive of recycling and if re-elected as a Commissioner will strive to promote such initiatives to help to change our carbon footprint and the way our actions affect our planet.

Housing:-

The provision of public sector housing in the district could be increased. Sheltered accommodation for the elderly could also be provided and this would help to free up homes for those with greatest need. The existing housing stock in the district should be maintained to the highest possible standard and legislation enforced where necessary to ensure environmental standards etc. are met.

Traffic:-

Greater assistance should be provided towards addressing the increasing traffic congestion in Onchan. Improvements and regular communication with the Department of Transport should be made to find better ways to ensure the safety aspects of traffic in housing areas and I would continue to promote speed calming initiatives.

Education:-

I believe proposals for a secondary school in Bemahague would provide a much needed facility for the growing community and this will improve education resources and could also help to ease traffic congestion. I have encouraged Junior Board meetings with the Commissioners and local primary schools and would look to expand these further to include secondary schools.

Issues I intend to tackle

Law and Order:-

Onchan is a rapidly growing community which obviously increases the need for more local police. I support local community and high visibility policing and would welcome an increased number of outreach workers to give support to the community.

Neighbourhood watch schemes, CCTV and appropriate street lighting would help deter crime and I have attended regular PACT (Police and Community Together) meetings to listen to concerns and work together on local issues.

Youth Facilities/Amenities:-

I have progressed several recreational schemes within the district including the Pirate Ship at Jubilee Park, the Wembley Arena at the Rec and have supported a proposed Skate Park in the village. Improvements to the Onchan Community Centre, Onchan Leisure Park and ensuring safety of the playgrounds are schemes I would support to attract more visitors to enjoy these amenities.

I take pride in living in Onchan and if re-elected would continue to work toward maintaining and improving the existing facilities.

Care in the Community:-

I believe we all have our part to play and we all have the right to enjoy a quality life in our Community. Onchan's older residents and disabled residents should equally be given the opportunity to enjoy the facilities such as the halls, clubs, bowling greens, tennis courts, library, parks and glens. I firmly believe in family values and my focus will continue to be to help where possible within the Community to make this district a safe and peaceful place to enjoy and live.
