

- Review our systems and processes to see where technology can be implemented, to improve efficiency and reduce costs
- Amalgamate duplicated functions within the civil service to make the most effective use of our government workforce
- Ensure that we protect the most vulnerable members of our society, as we review the scope of government

Secure – our quality of life, to preserve our heritage and maintain a firm foundation on which to build the Island's future.

- Implement a workable Freedom of Information Act
- Ensure that there is suitable affordable housing
- Preserve the Identity of our villages and communities by preventing amalgamation with the surrounding areas in any boundary review
- Hold regular drop-in surgeries to increase accountability to the community
- Work with the Department of Infrastructure to ensure that the local concerns of our villages, are represented well in future road development decisions
