We must finally get this site cleared with the long term hope of putting it to good use.

DOUGLAS PROMENADE

Repair work continues after last winter's storms.

We must have a promenade that is fit for business. It's the first impression for many thousands of people coming to the Island each year - it's our gateway. The current journey along the prom is far from ideal.

The £10million investment earmarked for the project is a welcome start. More will be needed to eventually complete it. It's good news for Douglas and the Island and will help lift the perception of the capital.



REGENERATION

Work has started to resurface the walkways and I support this initiative but it's only the start of an ongoing project that will take time and money to deliver.
