The people of Garff deserve to be treated fairly; matters such as sewage treatment for Laxey need resolving now. Government and decision makers must not be allowed to "kick the can down the road". This is a matter of urgent public concern.

Economic fairness

I will work tirelessly to develop high-quality partnerships in the local community in order to help rebalance our economy and to improve social and economic fairness. Despite increases in average salary rates 16.5% of employees in 2020 earned less than the Isle of Man Living Wage - up from 15.7% in 2019 (IoM Earnings Survey 2020). Many people struggle to make ends meet and to take a full part in our society. Average earnings figures mean nothing when the statistic is distorted by the huge salaries paid to some high earners.

Public services

I will endeavour to ensure that our public services remain in public ownership and will oppose the outsourcing of our essential services. We all lose when services are outsourced. Inevitably, as end users, we experience lower quality - whilst well paid, secure jobs are sacrificed on the altar of profit — often forcing people into precarious, poorly paid roles. The only beneficiaries are wealthy shareholders in the private companies.

Accountability

I believe that we need to develop legislative accountability and establish direct election to the legislative council. I will challenge the gravy train of unelected appointments, and work to devolve more powers to local government to deliver services, whilst at the same time ensuring local authorities are fit for purpose. I want to see transparent tendering in place to provide real value for money in the development of our island's infrastructure.

Sustainability

It is imperative that we do not allow our next government to kick the can down the road like the current administration. I will work to build a greener, more sustainable future. Worldwide, economies are adopting greener, more sustainable solutions and we should be leading the way. We must develop appropriate greener strategies to improve the future for everyone on the island. New technologies can be harnessed to boost our economy and provide lasting benefits for us all. The sooner we begin to make an effective transition away from a fossil-fuel based economy the faster we will realise the benefits.

Fight inequality

I will strive to ensure equality across all sections of society and remove obstacles that hinder opportunity and talent. My top priorities

Educational Opportunities

As a teacher I see each day that not all students are ready to learn during their school days. Some take longer and so miss opportunities to become educated and skilled. By investing in education, for all age groups, we can help more people to realise their potential and empower them to take on a greater role in our society.

Economy and Poverty

Our economy doesn't work for all of us. Despite increases in average salary rates, 16.5% of employees in 2019 earned less than the Isle of Man Living Wage - up from 15.7% in 2019 (IoM Earnings Survey 2020). People living below this level face a difficult struggle to make ends meet and to fully engage in our vibrant society. Rebalancing and diversifying our economy is a vital step to ensuring we are all better off in the future.

Health and Wellbeing

Our policies require refocusing to reduce inequality. Greater investment and earlier interventions would actually reduce future costs to the services. The present underfunding of essential services is having seriously detrimental effects. It is therefore imperative that we rebalance the island's budgetary spending to ensure that funding is delivered to the areas of most need, and not wasted on frivolous projects.

Social Issues

Poverty is on the increase. Our island GDP more than doubled in the years 2006-2018. But, shamefully, this hasn't led to any real increase in living standards on the island. By rebalancing parts of our economy we can alleviate poverty and improve poor standards of social care. The building of truly affordable green housing and measures to ensure that off-island speculation in the housing market is reduced or halted, is essential to enable our future generations to live at home. Our community spirit needs to be fostered and not taken for granted in these difficult times.
